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Assessment of Bachelor of Christian Leadership Degree Program Learning Objectives (PLOs)

Introduction

The Bachelor of Christian Leadership (BCL) degree is offered only through the EC online program at Ecclesia College. Between the Fall of 2019 and the Spring of 2022, twenty eight students graduated with the BCL degree through the EC online program, although other students regularly choose to take leadership courses as electives.

As an institution of biblical higher education, Ecclesia College prepares and enables graduates and alumni to achieve competence in seven broad areas: Biblical Worldview & Faith, Critical & Creative Thinking, Effective Communication, Integrity, Leadership, Lifelong Learning, and Service & Stewardship. Students seeking a BCL degree will also be prepared to demonstrate major field competency in seven programmatic areas:

Program Learning Objective 1: Biblical Concepts of Leadership

Ecclesia College graduates will apply biblical concepts of leadership to meet the needs of diverse audiences.

<u>Instrument Measures.</u> (1) LEAD 2315 Intro. to Leadership Final Project; (2) LEAD 4385 Small Groups in the Church Contemporary Research Paper; (3) LEAD 4365 Case Studies in Leadership, LEAD 4375 Ethical Leadership or LEAD 4395 Ethical Decisions in the Workplace Course Results.

Measure #1: The Introduction to Leadership (formerly Biblical Concepts of Leadership) course is an institutional requirement for the Christian Leadership major. It introduces servant-leadership through the lens of scripture with Jesus as the role model. The course examines the roles and qualities of leadership in Christian ministry. As a final project, students are required to either 1) observe three different settings in which a Christian leader is leading or supervising using biblical principles, or 2) interview three Christian leaders. A written evaluation of either the observations or interviews of three leaders is assigned and graded.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively on their final project as demonstrated below.

<u>Result:</u> The benchmark was met by a collective number of 14 students completing this measure with an average score of 94.2%.

Measure #2: The Small Groups in the Church course is an institutional requirement for the Christian Leadership major. The class is a comprehensive study of small group ministry and includes leadership and practical strategies for assessment, development, and discipleship processes of small groups. The final project of the course is a contemporary research paper where students defend a personal philosophy of 1) how to start a small group, 2) how to lead a small group, 3) how to assess the efficiency of a small group, and 4) how to facilitate growth and transformation for a small group ministry.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively on their research paper as demonstrated below.

Measure #3: Students are required to choose two out of the following courses for the Bachelor of Christian Leadership degree: LEAD 4365 Case Studies in Leadership, LEAD 4375 Ethical Leadership, and/or LEAD 4395 Ethical Decisions in the Workplace. These classes explore leadership concepts from varying angles measured against biblical principles in a diversity of organizational settings.

The benchmark for these three courses is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively over six semesters as demonstrated below.

Program Learning Objective 2: Spiritual Leadership

Ecclesia College graduates will learn patterns of devotional practice and personal growth that will equip one for spiritual leadership.

<u>Instrument Measures.</u> (1) BIBL 3355 Understand & Apply the Bible Final Essay; (2) LEAD 1355 Mentoring Foundations: Grids for Life & Learning Field Assignments; (3) BIBL 3345 Worship in the Old Testament Essay #1; (4) BIBL 4345 Hebrew Wisdom Literature Final Essay.

Measure #1: The Understand & Apply the Bible course is an institutional requirement for the Christian Leadership major. Students survey principles and practices of Bible study along with methods of application for personal growth. The final essay requires the interpretation and application of select passages of scripture students have to choose from, including an explanation of how they might apply the passage to their personal lives.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively on their final essay.

<u>Result:</u> The benchmark was met by a collective number of 10 students completing this measure with an average score of 91.2%.

<u>Measure #2:</u> The Mentoring Foundations: Grids for Life and Learning course is an institutional requirement for all majors. From Fall 2019 – Spring 2022, the class has been taken by 54 students with an average final score of 90.9%.

As an example of a specific measurement of PLO 2, students are asked to engage and share what they are learning with a mentee for six graded field assignments in the course. These field assignments are a practicum of accurate communication and impartation of the class material, which builds personal character in both the student and the willing disciple they are assigned to teach.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to score 75% or higher on their field assignments.

<u>Result:</u> The benchmark was met by a collective number of 14 students completing this measure with an average score of 84.8%.

Measure #3: The Worship in the Old Testament course is an institutional requirement for the Christian Leadership major. Students study the content and practice of worship in ancient Israel as foundational to patterns of contemporary Christian worship. From Fall 2019 – Spring 2022, the class was taken by 13 students with an average final grade of 83.1%.

As an example of an assignment specific to PLO 2, students are asked to compose four required essays in the course. Essay #1 has been chosen to illustrate assessment of student learning. This graded assignment requires students to write about worship in the Old Testament with a contemporary application.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively on Essay #1.

<u>Result:</u> The benchmark was met by a collective number of 3 students completing this measure with an average score of 88.9%.

<u>Measure #4:</u> Hebrew Wisdom Literature is a Bible/Theology class students may elect to choose within the Christian Leadership major. The course covers elements of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and the Song of Songs, revealing the spiritual value and ethical implications in the books. From Fall 2019 to Spring 2022, the class was taken by 17 students with an average final score of 89.9%.

The entire course relates well to PLO 2, requiring students to comment on interpretive problems and discuss how the primary theological or ethical contribution of the passages can be applied to their lives.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively on their final essay.

<u>Instrument Measures.</u> (1) BIBL 2335 Life of Christ and BIBL 3315 Acts Course Results; (2) CCMM 2355 Evangelism Discipleship, CCMM 3355 Foundations of Christian Missions and CCMM 4355 Theology of Missions Course Results; (3) EDMN 1355 Understanding Teaching Student Presentations and CCMM 2355 Evangelism Discipleship Presentation and Reflection Paper.

<u>Measure #1:</u> Institutional requirements for the Christian Leadership major include the Life of Christ and Acts courses, which equip students with a vital understanding of the Gospel so they can share their faith intelligently. The principles discussed are applicable not only to spiritual formation, but to missions and the evangelism practicum.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher as their final score in the courses indicated below.

Measure #3: Evangelism Discipleship and Understanding Teaching are classes students can choose to take for the Bachelor of Christian Leadership degree. Like the courses above, they have specific practicum assignments relating to PLO 3. For instance, the Student Presentation assignment in Understanding Teaching requires students to prepare themselves to share the gospel with a person from a category they choose. Evangelism Discipleship requires an Evangelism Practicum and Reflection Paper for students to share the gospel with three different people who are not Christians. Measure #3 looks at each of these specific assignments for the two classes.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively for each of the two assignments during the period indicated below.

<u>Measure #1:</u> The Understand & Apply the Bible course is an institutional requirement for the Christian Leadership major. Students learn and apply many methods of Bible study and are required to explain the scriptures in a series of assignments including worksheets, discussion forums, and essays.

The required Contemporary Research Paper in the class is a prime example of an assignment that fulfills PLO 4.

Program Learning Objective 5: Critical Thinking & Decision Making

Ecclesia College graduates will integrate Christian principles into critical thinking and decision making in one's personal and/or professional life.

<u>Instrument Measures.</u> (1) HUMN 2355 Biblical Worldview Course Results; (2) THEO 3355 Christian Theology Course Results; (3) LEAD 4375 Ethical Leadership Final Paper.

Measure #1: The Biblical Worldview course is an institutional requirement for the Christian Leadership major. Students study five dominant worldviews in the class, as well as develop a biblically and theologically informed worldview of their own. They also 1) explain and defend their own formulation of a Christian worldview, 2) apply their worldview to their own lives through the eleven areas of culture, and 3) write about how they intend to apply their Christian worldview to their vocations and lives.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively as their final score.

Measure #2: The Christian Theology course is an institutional requirement for the Christian Leadership major. A systematic study of Christian doctrine is covered in the class, requiring students to 1) articulate and defend personal doctrinal positions with biblical support while interacting critically with other theological views, 2) integrate theological doctrines for personal and corporate spiritual renewal and development, and 3) respond to contemporary ethical, social, and religious problems from an informed theological and biblical worldview. All of these required course objectives support PLO 5 and are embedded throughout class assignments such as quizzes, discussion forums, and a final research paper.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively as their final score.

<u>Measure #1:</u> The Small Groups in the Church course is an institutional requirement for the Christian Leadership major. Students learn the dynamics of small group leadership in the class. Among the objectives is the facilitation of meaningful prayer and dynamic discussions in small group sessions, which relate directly to PLO 6.

The benchmark is an aggregate of 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively as their final score.

<u>Measure #3:</u> Students are required to choose two out of the following courses for the Bachelor of Christian Leadership degree: LEAD 4365 Case Studies in Leadership, LEAD 4375 Ethical Leadership or LEAD 4395 Ethical Decisions in the Workplace. These classes explore leadership concepts from varying angles measured against biblical principles in a diversity of organizational settings.

The benchmark for these three courses is 80% of students to earn 75% or higher collectively over six semesters.

<u>Instrument Measures.</u> (1) STDV 1355 Goals, Priorities & Attitudes and STDV 4335 Ministry Project Course Results; (2) Senior Ministry Project Final Essay.

<u>Measure #1:</u> EC students learn how to develop a ministry project and formulate a strategy to implement it upon graduation especially through principles learned in STDV 1355 Goals, Priorities & Attitudes and STDV 4335 Senior Ministry Project (the online capstone course for this degree).

The benchmark for Goals, Priorities & Attitudes is an aggregate number of 80% of students must earn a minimum of 75% or higher collectively as their final score. The benchmark for the Senior Ministry Project, however, is established in the Academic Catalog as 100% of graduates must earn a minimum grade of B (or 81% according to the EC official grading scale) in their senior capstone course.

The benchmark for the Senior Ministry Project is established and published in the Academic Catalog as 100% of graduates must earn a minimum grade of B (or 81% according to the EC official grading scale) in their senior capstone course.
